



ROCKY MOUNTAIN YOUTH CORPS 2023 Aspen Wilderness Trails Mini Crew Member

- Partner Agency:** US Forest Service White River National Forest- Aspen-Sopris Ranger District
- Positions Available:** 2
- Location:** Aspen, CO
- Tentative Dates:** May 22nd - August 26th, 2023 (or upon completion of 14 weeks).
- Stipend:** \$625/week living allowance. Total amount will be \$8,750.
- AmeriCorps:** 450-hour AmeriCorps Education Award (\$1,824.07) upon successful completion
- Plus:** Boot/gear reimbursement up to \$400

Public Land Corps Hiring Authority upon completion of 640 hours on public lands.

Shared housing is provided. Rooms are double occupancy with a shared kitchen, bathroom and laundry. Alcohol and non-prescribed and illegal drugs are not permitted in Forest Service housing. Training and certifications provided may include first aid, patrol training, and crosscut saw training. Most field gear is provided including a backpack, backcountry gear, work gloves, first aid supplies, rain jacket and Forest Service uniform.

Program Overview:

This position will serve as part of the Aspen-Sopris Ranger District Wilderness Ranger Crew, led primarily by the Forest Service Lead Wilderness Ranger. The primary duty of this Wilderness Ranger position is to conduct Wilderness patrols which include trails maintenance, interacting with visitors, and campsite/trash clean-up. This position will model Leave No Trace ethics at all times. Rangers collect data including wilderness campsite inventory information and visitor encounter information. This position requires overnight camping in remote locations for up to 10 days, but typically service weeks are 4 days/3 nights (Friday-Monday) of backpacking. It also requires extensive hiking (up to 12 miles per day), strenuous labor, heavy backpacks and frequent public contact. Additionally, rangers will be clearing and maintaining over 300 miles of Wilderness trails on the Aspen-Sopris Ranger District. Many of the district trails are located within the wild and remote Maroon Bells-Snowmass Wilderness, Hunter Fryingpan Wilderness, Collegiate Peak Wilderness, Raggeds Wilderness and Holy Cross Wilderness. Crosscut saws and hand tools will be used for log-out and trail maintenance in the wilderness. Crosscut saw certification and hand tool training will be provided by the Forest Service. Forest Service will provide tents, backpacks, sleeping bags, stoves, first aid kits, and some rain gear. Each person selected

must provide sturdy leather high-top hiking boots, water bottles, non-cotton base layers, socks, winter hats, and any other personal items for backcountry travel.

General Qualifications:

This is an incredibly mentally and physically demanding position. This cannot be understated. Must have the ability to serve outdoors, unsupervised, in high elevation environments in all types of weather. The successful applicant must have excellent communication skills and be able to serve with and communicate effectively with a wide range of people and personalities. Individual must be able to function well as a team member. Experience in recreation management (specifically in challenging outdoor work or service) preferred but not necessary.

If living in government housing, must keep their space clean.

Service Statement:

Qualifications:

- High School Diploma or equivalent
- 18 Years of age or older with a valid driver license and clean driving record.
- Eligibility to work in the US
- This position is supported by the Public Lands Hiring Authority which requires candidates to be between the ages of 16 to 30.
- Pre-service background screening required, including FBI background check
- Must be able to provide proof of eligibility to work in the United States

CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT: AmeriCorps members will be subject to all state and federal laws, and the rules and regulations of OSHA and RMYC. The member is expected to fully understand and adhere to the rules, regulations and code of conduct as described in the AmeriCorps member manual. 10/19 Policy violations will result in disciplinary action according to program guidelines, including written warnings, fines, suspension without stipend, and/or termination. The AmeriCorps member is accountable for meeting or exceeding the responsibilities of this position as described above, and will be evaluated at mid-term and end-term by Corps Program Staff, with input from project hosts.

Successful completion is contingent on both AmeriCorps education award hours and service through the agreed upon term end date.

This position is classified as Temporary Exempt and is a seasonal position with no benefits. Rocky Mountain Youth Corps is an Equal Opportunity Employer.
